THE LIFE SAVING EQUIPMENT OF MISSION VIEJO FIRE FIGHTERS

ast month, the Mission Viejo Reporter spent some time with the firefighters of Station No. 9 near The Shops at Mission Viejo. Out of the 72 different Orange County Fire Authority fire stations in Orange County, Station No. 9 is one of four that is the home of the Urban Search And Rescue equipment. We got a first-hand look at all the emergency equipment that this station has to offer.

Station No. 9 always has 8 firefighters on duty everyday, 24/7, running AB & C shifts. Here's the breakdown:

#### **ENGINE 9**

4 person crew (2 trained & qualified paramedics)
Structure and wildland firefighters
500 gallons of water on board
Over 2000 feet of hose
Transport patients from 911 calls to area hospitals.

4 person crew
Trained in Technical Rescue
Confined Space Rescue
Trench Collapse Rescue
Structural Collapse Rescue
Swiftwater/Boat Rescue
Helicopter Rescue




I also want to that the wonderful, patient staff that I have had the pleasure of working with over the years. Obviously too many to

# FIRE SAF RE-SAFE HOLIDAY T

Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.


Did you know nearly half of all holiday fires are started by candles? Please keep lit candles away from decorations and other combustible material. Also, keep children and pets away from lit candles.

Before heading out or to bed, blow out lit candles and turn off all lights and electrical decorations.

Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop. Remember to "Stand by your Pan."

When picking a tree, choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched. Place the tree at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, candles, or heat vents. Add

water to the tree daily to keep it from drying out and never use lit candles to decorate the tree. Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.





# HOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS Rising From the Bottom

Being homeless is never any fun, especially during the holidays. Nobody knows it better than Richard Morlev. Richard was homeless not too long ago, and since then he has taken it upon himself to help others in his situation. Here's Richards story:

Born in Canada in 1942, and raised by

his grandparents, Richard's grandfather started the first Rotary Club in Canada, making Rotary International a household word. Richard became a very successful businessman and traveled the

world as vice-president of a manufacturing company. Richard says: "I've had a fantastic life, I've seen the world."

In 2007, Richard moved his company to Laguna Niguel. His grandfather taught him to "Pay-itforward", so Richard joined the Laguna Niguel Rotary Club.



In 2010, Richard had a massive stoke, and was in the hospital for about three months. During his rehab, Medicare came to him and said "there will be no more payments." Richard needed care and moved into a local Assisted Living facility in Mission Viejo. That

cost him \$3600.00 a month. It wasn't long before Richard was out of money. To reduce his monthly expenditures, he rented a room, but that didn't work out.

Richard began living in his car trying to find work, but that proved to be very difficult because of his age and health. One night while sleeping in his car he saw a guy on a recliner bicycle, and thought that was a great idea.

Richard now lives bare-bones. He has a roommate who he splits rent with. Richard says

he lives on about \$1.74 a day in food. A total of 900 calories a day is all Richard says he needs. He thanks, Age Well Senior Services for the free meals they provide at the Murray Center, which Richard rides his bike to every Tuesday and Thursday.

Richard volunteers at several centers helping homeless and sharing stories and advise. His recliner trike serves as a way for him to get the message out to respect and care for the homeless.

# THUNDER LIGHTAING



The City of Mission Viejo has just completed adding battery back-up systems to seven more traffic signals on Muirlands Blvd and Jeronimo Road.

Last month, the lightning storm which hit Mission Viejo in the early morning triggered the battery back-up systems in about twenty signals including five of the new ones.

Without the battery back-ups, these signals would have gone into Red Flash mode causing traffic delays during the morning rush hour.

We now have battery back-up systems in the signals on all major arterials.

# Tiny Lights of MISSION VIEJO MISSION VIEJO

Beginning October 1 and finishing on Thanksgiving, The City installs all of its beautiful holiday lights.

#### Here are some fun facts:

- 10,000 strands of lights
- 70 lights per strand = 700,000 LED lights
- Begin installing lights October 1 of each year; and finish by Thanksgiving. All are taken down and stored by the end of
- It takes 3 different contracting firms along with a City staff to coordinate and install all of the decorations.
- The star on the Community Tree at La Paz and Chrisanta is 4 feet across.
- It takes 2 large shipping containers to store all of the lights.
- Over 700 extension cords are needed.
- Over 23,750 feet of electrical tape are used. That's 4.5 miles of tape.

People come from all over Orange County to look at the 700,000 tiny lights!





## Mission Viejo's Third Recreation Center Opens: Offers Handball, Physical Fitness

Grand opening festivities were held on March 27, as Marguerite Recreation Center became the third such facility to be made available to residents of the community.

One of the most complete adult community physical fitness facilities in Orange County, Marguerite Center in New Madrid, joins Montanoso in the La Paz neighborhood and Sierra Center in the Granada Homes neighborhood.

"Our three recreation centers represent an investment of more than \$2 million, and we believe Mission Viejo is second to none in providing a balanced recrea-tional and physical fitness program for its residents," Jury Curran, director of recreation Mission Vieto Company, said

Located on a 51/2-acre site at the intersection of Marguerite Parkway and Trabuco Road, Marguerite Center features a 4500-square-foot free-form swimming pool

Three championship indoor handball courts are provided, and a charter handball association is being organized within the community Sauna baths, ja-zuzzi pool and a completely equipped physical fitness room ste available.

The Center has nearly 8,000 square feet under roof, including a wing which is temporarily being used as a sales office for New Madrid Homes.

Outdoor recreational facilities include four regulation lighted tennis courts and two lighted and volleyball courts

A unique children's tot fort and play area as well as a croquet area are covered with special artificial Ozite turf

"We are especially pleased with the turl in the children's play area because it will have cushioning effect and will defi-nitely reduce the possibility of

injuries." Curran said. Snack bar, barbeque and pic-nic facilities are adjacent to the multi-level building, which fea-tures a spacious adult founge with deep curpeting and exten-sive window areas overlooking picturesque Trabuco Canyon and the San Joaquin mountains. Grand opening festivities will

continue through April 10. Handball stars Stully Singer and Dr. Steven August will appear in exhibition matches on April 10. at 1 p.m. Singer was world four-wall hundball singles champion from 1967 through 1969, and Dr. August is 1970 National invitational four-wall singles champion.

The other recreation centers at Mission Viejo — Sierra and Montanosio — are designed for specific activities." Curran said Sierra Center is "a neighbor-hood center and home base for our Nadadores swim team which has made quite a name for itself in meets during the past year." ho said

Montanoso is the social-cultural center and has many indoor activities such as art, bridge. dancing and teen recreation.

The recreational facilities at the three centers include eight tennis courts, three Olympicsized swimming pools, numer ous meeting rooms, snack bars. playgrounds, volleyball courts, croquet areas, sauna baths, jacuzzi pools, wading pools, baskerball courts, adult and teen lounges. A full-time professional staff plans programs encompassing all facets of recreation

"The facilities of all three centers are available to members," Curran said. A 32-passenger family fun bus' is used for special events throughout the year and as a shuttle service for youthful members during the summer





# WAIT A MINUTE MR. POSTMAN MISSION VIEJO'S FAVORITE MAIL CARRIER

For the 27 years Mission Viejo postman Jay Waterman has been delivering mail to homes in Mission Viejo, 16 of those years to the same neighborhood. Meet Jay Waterman. Jay is a proud Native American from the Mohawk tribe. It's easy to spot Jay with his do-rag and tribal tattoos.



Jay makes about 475 stops a day in his trusty old mail truck. He knows about everybody, and enjoys stopping, chatting and listening to his customers when he can

squeeze in the time. Often, he's offered water, pizza and hot dogs and many other things along the route.

The **Mission Viejo Reporter** asked Jay if he's ever been bitten by a dog as a postman. He said "only once". One time, a dog burst though a screen door and sunk it's meat-eating fangs into Jay's arm. He had to go to the doctor for a precautionary tetanus shot. Jay said, "getting the shot hurt more than the bite."

For the last 16 years Jay has been driving the exact same postal truck and he loves it. It has become part of him, he knows every little nuance of the truck.



Each postman at the Mission Viejo Post Office is required to do six mandatory movements at each stop:

- 1. Take off seat belt
- 2. Put in Park
- 3. Put on emergency brake
- 4. Take keys out
- 5. Turn wheels to curb
- 6. Carry satchel to porch to use as guard if necessary
